

Liner Replacement Checklist

If you have any questions, or if anything on this list is unresolved as your date nears, please email or call to let us know!

- Pool must be empty and bone dry, or close to it. TO get the last few inches of water out, puncture the liner in several spots with a shovel, rake, or similar tool. This will allow any remaining water to soak into the ground. This may take several days.
- New liner is on site and accessible, in an unopened box.
- New thru-wall skimmer and return on site.
- “Live” electrical outlet for our tools.
- Working water source with enough hose to easily reach pool.
Note: a leaking hose or spigot will waste water and cause a big mess and possible damage.
- Any other supplies you purchased (wall foam and adhesive; Gorilla Pad/Rhino Shield/floor pad, etc.) are on site.
Note: I do not recommend foam cove.
- Prepared for payment of balance.
